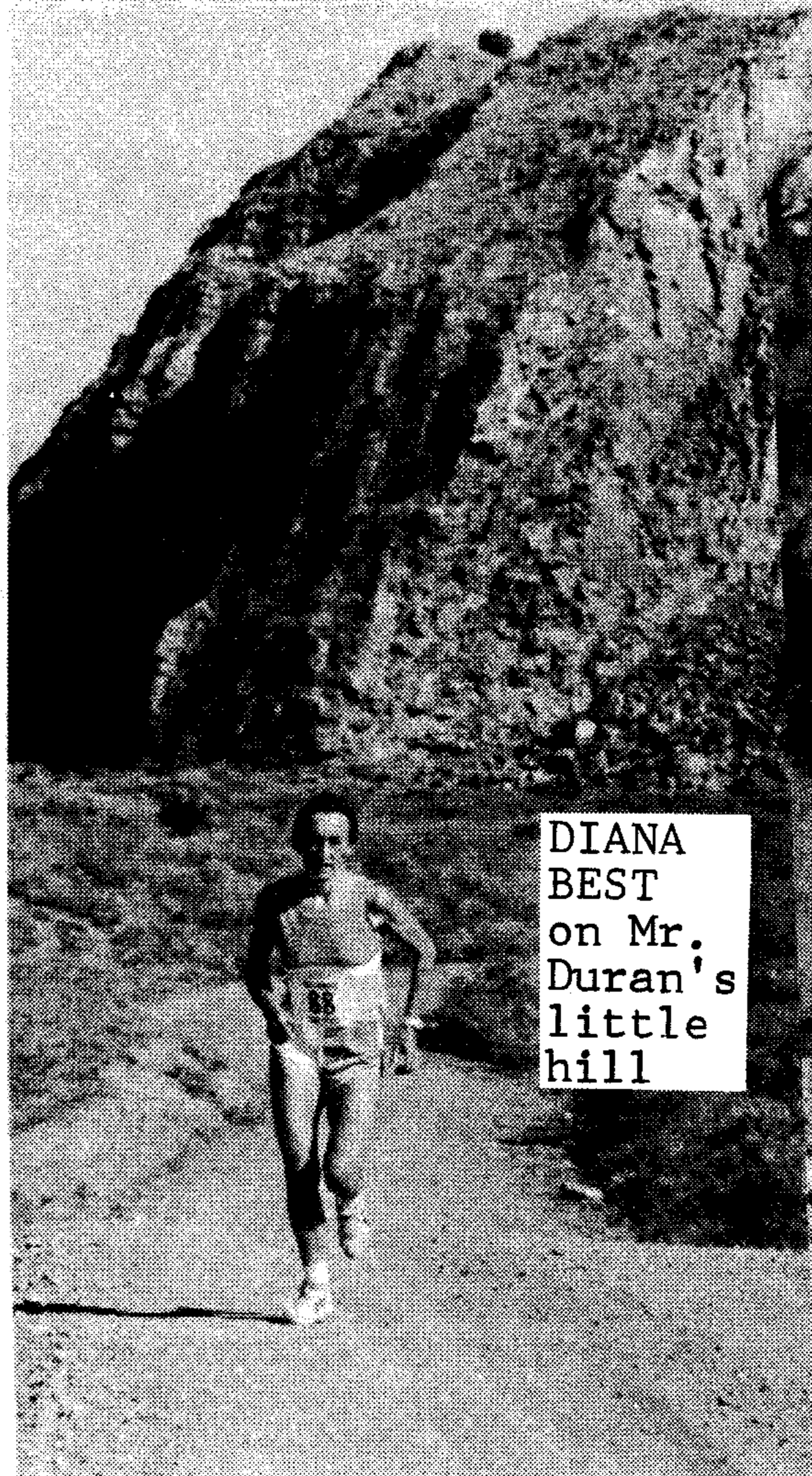

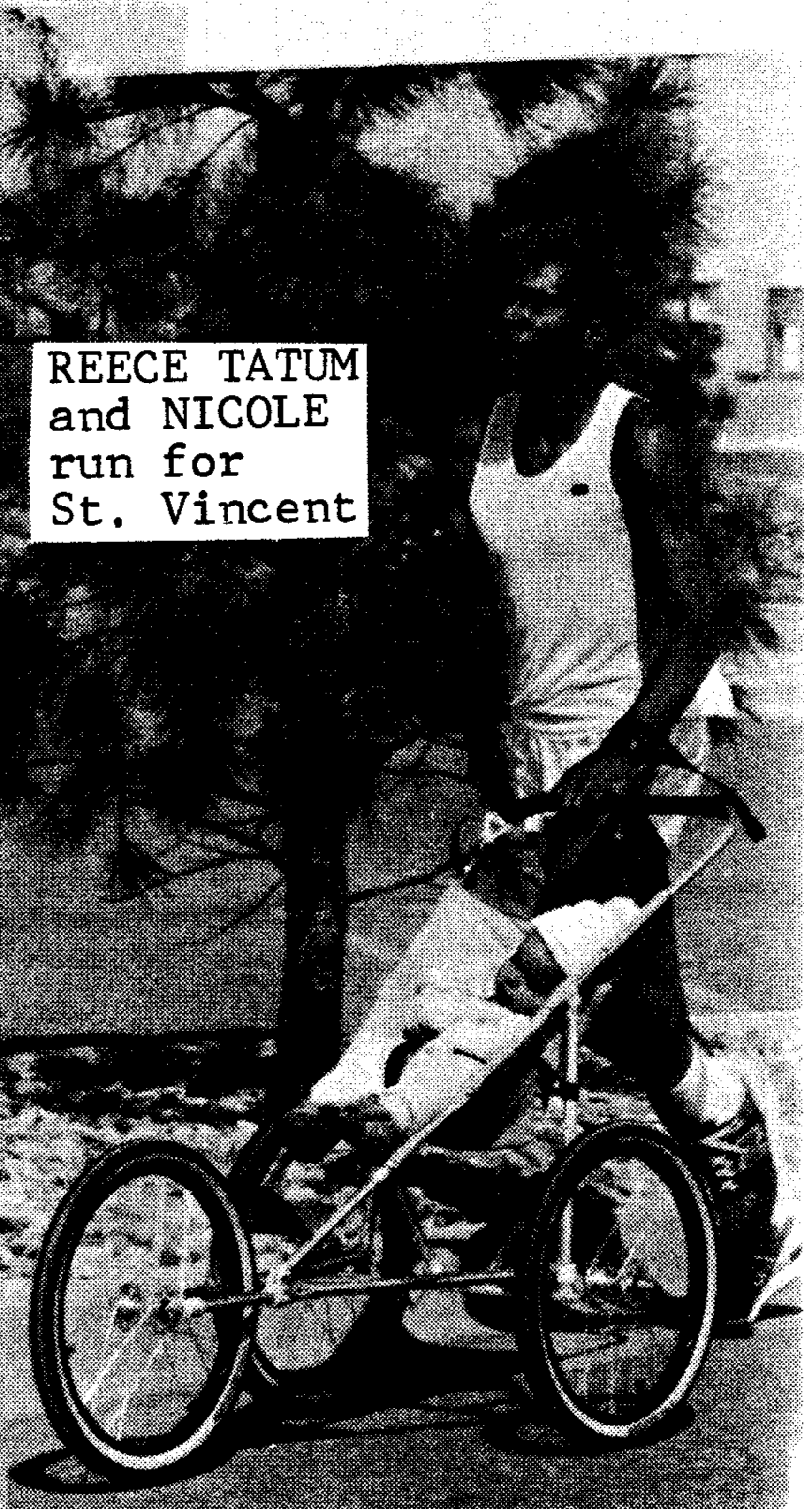

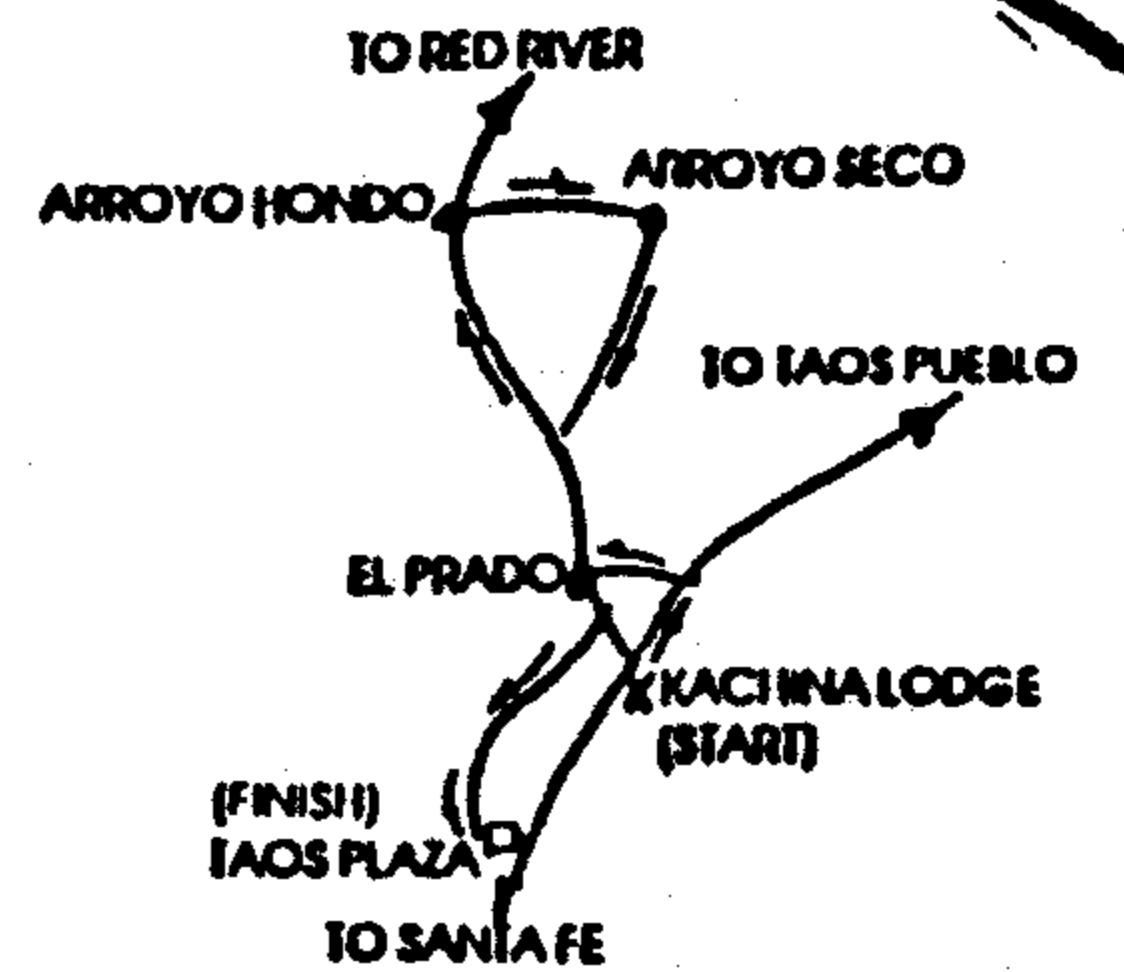

Plus Open 1/2 Marathon: 13.1 Miles
Team Relay (5 person): 4 legs of 5 miles each,
anchor leg of 6.2 miles
Date and Time: Sunday, June 26, 1988 - 7:00 AM
Start: Kachina Lodge, North Pueblo Road
Finish: Taos Plaza



Course: Start at 6,900 ft. Taos, short detour to Taos Pueblo, north on Hwy. 3 to Arroyo Hondo, ascend to 7,200 ft. Arroyo Seco, return to Town Plaza.

Entry: Individual - \$12 (race day - \$15)
 Team - \$50 (race day - \$60)

Relay teams must provide their own transportation to exchange point; only one vehicle per team.

Awards ceremony at 1:00 PM - Team, individual trophies, merchandise, t-shirts
