Boston awaits! Bill Forsyth won his 7th straight 30-39 State Pentathlon in Los Alamos on August 27 and placed in his age group in Houston at the U.S. Masters championships September 16-18 first in High Jump, second Pentathlon, third Javelin, fourth Triple Jump and fifth Discus & Shot. In the Sandia Mt. Run-Around 80K Relay on September 25, the second overall women's team was Sally Dookittle, Maureen Herrick and Cathy Tibbets plus Cathy Pearce finishing in 6:34. Second place in the 50 and up men's group was Jerry Dorbin, Dale Goering and Andy Nava, plus Aaron Goldman, finishing in 6:37. Andy turned his toes to hamburger on that one!

At the Imogene Pass Run from Ouray, Colorado to Telluride September 10th, Pete Richards was 31st overall out of 175 in the 18-miler at 2:53 Mary Nichols was 6th woman in 3:24, and Jose Garcia posted a 3:49
