Be there at 5:45 if you want to run, otherwise, BYObeer and be there by 7 o'clock. And plan on entering your own kids in the race. Help find sponsors at \$250 to \$350 each. We're giving tee shirts to all finishers and charging only a \$1 entry fee, so the economics of this one are different than any others we've done. We have an idea Long Dave may be pleasantly stunned by the size of the turn out for the Corrida de los Niños.

Don't look for Dale Goering, David or Jimmy Macias or Mel Richkind at the meeting, next week. That's the day after the Boston Marathon, Patriots' Day, April 16, & all four are entered. Good Luck to Dale, Jimmy, Dave and Mel. Or, as Dale might say, "Luck has nothing to do with it."
