The VII World Veteran's Games were filled with at least 4,800 such stories I am sure. There were 28 different track and field events offered for men and women over forty years of age in five year age groups. The oldest were two men from India entered in events for 95 year old men and one woman from the states who was 80 years old.

The Games started with an inspiring opening ceremony with all the entered athletes marching into and around the track. We marched, divided into our age groups and wearing our track clothes. Many countries have uniforms. There is no national recognition as far as the number of gold medals, etc.. for each country and no playing of anthems. In fact the medal presentations are quite unobtrusive. Personally I feel the Olympics would be better with this sort of attitude.

Everyone seems to be celebrating the joy of fellowship and the pleasure of being able to participate with newly made friends. It is too bad governments can't meet together in such a common ground. It didn't matter if you spoke the same language; pins and or T-shirts can be exchanged with sign language very well. People can be cheered for in any language also.

There were 52 countries represented, some I have never heard of before, e.g. the island of Nine sent one man. The United States had 31 men and 88 women representatives. The USSR was not represented, but Cuba, China, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Rumania, and Yugoslavia all had athletes entered.

We learned to ride the tram, watch for traffic

driving on the left, queue up, order our tea black or white, drive over shutter bumps, ring up a friend or we could take in the horse gallops. The food was tasty and varied, but I had a real need for some green chili by the time we returned.

The Australian and New Zealand people were unbelievably friendly. We were taken into homes and invited to go on sightseeing trips. Of course I have always found "runner people" very much like this.

This is the perfect event for people who enjoy participation and meeting people. One does not need to be a star athlete to attend these games, in fact I think we social athletes have a better time as we can relax and not worry about our performances. I want to encourage everyone over forty to plan to attend the next Veterans' Games in the Summer of 1989 in Eugene, Oregon. I'll introduce you to all my new friends.
